

Mineral Prospecting Licence Applications MPLA1/22 and MPLA2/22

Consultation Overview

Consultation open from 17 January to 10 April 2022

Purpose of Consultation

In accordance with the provisions of the Mineral Development Act (Northern Ireland) 1969, the Department for the Economy (the Department) has received two applications from Dalradian Gold Limited (the applicant), for Mineral Prospecting Licences (MPL). The Department has accepted the applications as valid.

The purpose of this document is to provide consultees with an overview of both applications and the consultation process for the applications. This consultation will run from 17 January 2022 for a period of 12 weeks, ending on 10 April 2022.

General Information

1. The two applications are for areas currently licensed by the Department to the applicant. The two licences, known as DG5/16 and DG6/16, will end on 31 May 2022.
2. The applicant holds Crown Estates Options for both areas. Precious metals i.e. gold and silver are vested in the Crown and the applicant has continued, and intends to continue, gold exploration in both these areas under their Crown Estates Options.
3. While there are two separate MPL applications under consideration, given that they involve the same applicant, are in adjacent geographical locations and are for similar activities, the Department has decided to combine the two consultations into one. Any issue raised in conjunction with either application that is not applicable to the other, will be considered as required.
4. The Department received these applications in November 2021.

Consultation Process

The objective of this consultation is to ensure that the Department publishes its' intention to grant the two MPLs and provide the general public with an opportunity to submit comments. This will help ensure that the Department receives a wide range of views and can take an informed decision on either the granting, or not, of the MPLs and/or on any additional terms and conditions that should be included in the MPLs.

The following outlines the consultation/notification process that the Department will follow for these two applications:

Any person wishing to make representations in respect of the applications must do so to the Department on, or before **10 April 2022**.

Section 11(5) of the Mineral Development Act (Northern Ireland) 1969 requires the Department to consider all representations made to it within the specified timeframe. After the consultation period has closed the Department will consider comments received. Once responses have been analysed, a decision will be taken on whether or not to grant the licences for applications MPLA1/22 and/or MPLA2/22.
